Norman Schwarzkopf. Additionally, he spent as much time as he could with the Civil Air Patrol and the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary. Mr. Toney worked with the Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools by presenting computer classes to the students of Derita ElemenMary.

Mr. Toney had been a member of Midwood Baptist Church since Easter of 1953.

Mr. Toney was also an extremely proud member of the Sons of the Republic of Texas.

Since the death of his wife, he had been a resident of Huntersville Oaks Nursing Home. Mr. Toney spent many imppy hours talking with his remaining brother and his sisters in Texas on the telephone. His older brother, Bill, recently made the trip from Austin to visit him.

Survivors include to his daughters Patricia Moore and husband, Jimmy Moore, Sandra Stone and her husband James Stone, all of Charlotte; two grandsons Marty Miller and Marley Stegall and wife Tammy Stegall; granddaughter, Lori Stegall; two great grandsons, J.T. Stegall and Jacob Stegall; brother, W.T. Toney, Jr.; three sisters Helen Toney, Nelma Wilkinson, and Demp Toney, of Texas, and numerous nieces and nephews also in Texas.
