

Elaine Mae (Bubik) Trochessett

PASCAGOULA, Miss. -- A funeral mass for Elaine Mae (Bubik) Trochessett, 72, daughter of Susan St. Cyr of Trinity, was celebrated at 10 a.m. Monday, April 2, 2001, at Our Lady of Victories Catholic Church in Pascagoula, Miss.

Burial followed in Jackson County Memorial Park in Pascagoula, Miss.

Mrs. Trochessett died Friday, March 30, at Singing River Hospital in Pascagoula, Miss. She had been hospitalized for three days following a massive coronary.

She was born May 5, 1928, in Akron, Ohio, the daughter of the late Joseph Bubik and Susan St. Cyr of Trinity.

She moved to Biloxi, Miss., with her family at a young age where she attended Gorenflo Elementary School, Mary L. Michel Junior High and Biloxi Senior High School.

She was preceded in death by her daughter, Ave' Marie Waldrup in 1984 and a son, John D. Trochessett Sr. in 1987.
