### **Travis Winston Waller**

CROCKETT-Funeral services for Travis Winston Waller, 75, were scheduled for 2 p.m. Wednesday at the First Presbyterian Church with Rev. Jim Tom Ainsworth officiating.

Burial will take place in the Evergreen Cemetery.

Mr. Waller died in his sleep Feb. 16 at his home.

He was a resident of Crockett since 1962.

He and Grady Cooper Waller, lived in Trinity and graduated from Trinity High School.

He was employed by First National bank of Trinity until he entered the U. S. Army in 1945. He served with distinction in the Fifth Army Command of North Africa and Italy during WWII.

Following the War, he attended American University in Washington and later studied at Sam Houston State, the University of Houston and the University of Texas at Austin.

He was employed by Texaco for ten years until 1962 when he became president of the former State National Bank of Lovelady. Hew established the Physical Supplies business in Crockett which he operated until 1993.

Mr. Waller was a member of the Crockett Public Library Board where he served as chairman for many years. He was also on the Board of Crockett Community Concerts, a contributing patron of the Piney Woods Fine Arts Association, and a past President of the Crockett Rotary Club where he was recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow.

He was a Deacon and Elder at the First Presbyterian Church.

He was preceded in death by brothers: Jim Grady Waller of Crockett, Don D. Waller of Houston and twin sister, La Beth Stephens of Austin.

Survivors include brothers: Dan L. and Bea Waller of Trinity; Coye Waller, Kittrell; and George Cooper Waller and Kay of Trinity.

He is also survived by one sister, Genevieve and James Robert McCaffety, Lake Livingston; a sister-in-law, Lesal "Bobbie" Waller, Crockett.
