# Woodrow Wilson Webster Sr.

TRINITY - Graveside services with military honors for Woodrow Wilson Webster Sr., 89, of San Antonio were held Friday, July 13, 2007, in the Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery. Pastor Bruce Guncle officiated.

Mr. Webster died peacefully Tuesday, July 10, in San Antonio with his family at his side.

Born Jan. 17, 1918, in Campbell County, Ky., he was the son of Oscar and Maud Blanch Harrison Webster. Mr. Webster was married to Lillie Mae Bickers in 1940 and served in the U.S. Army infantry during World War II. During the war he served in the Central Pacific Theater for nearly four years and was decorated with two Bronze Stars, the Good Conduct Medal and the American Defense Medal.

He was employed as a heavy equipment operator and railroad switchman before his retirement. He moved to San Antonio in 1982

and enjoyed traveling and spending time with his family. He was a member of the American Legion Post 0593 of Converse.

Mr. Webster was preceded in death in 1998 by his wife of 58 years.
