

DR. RAYMOND CHARLES WILLIFORD

Dr. Raymond Charles Williford, DVM "Doc," age 74, passed away Friday, February 25, 2005 at his home with his loving family by his side. Dr. Williford was a native Houstonian, born September 5, 1930 to Laura Erp and Baldwin Williford at St. Joseph's Hospital.

Dr. Williford attended Pershing Junior High School and was a 1948 graduate of Mirabeau B. Lamar High School. On August 31, 1951 he married his high school sweetheart, Martha Tullis, and the couple moved to College Station, where he realized his dream of graduating with a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from his beloved Texas A&M. Dr. Williford was a member of the Class of 1952.

While at A&M, he was a member of the Cadet Corps and was a Singing Cadet. Upon graduating from A&M, he served in the U.S. Air Force in Germany where he attained the rank of Captain. Dr. Williford was honorably discharged in 1956 and returned to Houston to practice medicine with the late Dr. R.D. Ward. In 1960, Dr. Williford and Martha moved to Crockett, where he fouded the Houston County Veterinary Hospital. Dr. Williford had many friends throughout Houston County as well as surrounding areas because of his caring and capassionate demeanor toward both patients and owners alike.

In 1972, Dr. Williford and his family returned to Houston where he founded the Bellaire West Veterinary Clinic. Dr. Williford practiced at this location from 1972 until 1994, when he was compelled to retire because of Parkinson's Disease.

Dr. Williford was a member of the Sharpstown Rotary Club from 1972 until 1993, The American Veterinary Medical Association, and The Texas Veterinary Association. Dr. Williford was an avid golfer and was privileged to receive recognition for his "Hole in One game." Dr. Williford loved fishing as well. Dr. Williford was well known for his beauitful handmade leather goods and designed and created many custom items for his clients.
