## Services Held In Matador For Brother Of Local Resident

Graveside rites for Glenn L. Woodruff, age 78, of Lubbock, and formerly of Matador, were held Friday afternoon, July 20, at the East Mound Cemetery in Matador. Officiating was Mike Crowley, minister of the Matador Church of Christ. Masonic rites were conducted by the Matador Masonic Lodge. Interment followed under the direction of Seigler Funeral Home of Matador.

Honorary pallbearers were Charles Johnson, Bill McKelvey, R. C. Giesecke, Bill Moss, Dick Pollard, and Mike Hoyle.

Mr. Woodruff died Tuesday, July 17, 2001, at a Lubbock nursing home. He was born March 9, 1923, at Mineral Wells and had been a lifelong resident of Matador, prior to moving to Lubbock about five years ago. He was the son of Jim and Lucy Woodruff, former Grapeland residents, and brother of Mrs. R. M. (Dorothy) Dailey of Grapeland.

A graduate of Matador High School, Mr. Woodruff attended Tarleton State College and graduated from Texas Tech. He was a veteran of World War II, and had operated a Ford dealership in Matador until his retirement, along with farming and ranching interests. He had resided in Lubbock about five years.

Mr. Woodruff was a member of the First United Methodist Church at Matador. He was a 50-year member of the Masonic Lodge and the York Rite Bodies. He was also a member of the Matador Lions Club, the VFW and the American Legion, and was active in the establishment of the Motley County Historical Museum.

Survivors include two daughters, Lou Anne Jameson of Matador and Lois Susannah Woodruff of Lubbock; one sister, Dorothy Dailey of Grapeland; four grandchildren, Whitney Jones of Lubbock, Rebecca Jameson of Denton, Justin

Jameson of Matador and Aaron Woodruff of Lubbock; and two great-grandchildren, Morgan and Judson Jones of Lubbock.

Memorials to the Motley County Historical Museum at Matador were suggested.
