Mr. A.P. "Uncle Al" Woods, age 90 of Crockett, passed away Saturday, Sept. 30 at his residence. Mr. Woods was born Aug. 6, 1910 in San Marcos to Joseph Earl and Ella Hattie Olgetree Woods. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy during WWII but the War Manpower Board decided he was needed elsewhere and sent him back to the Dixon Gun Plant where he was a foreman.
